Overview

- ❖ Physician Assistant Services of Texas LLP, (PAST) is a professional association of independent contractors who have been providing services in the North Texas area since 1997. PAST is created and owned by a physician assistant, well established and received throughout the area. Our professional association of 14+ advanced practice providers work in areas of cardiovascular adult and congenital, thoracic and transplant surgery for many surgeons. Our primary coverage area is several Dallas-Fort Worth hospitals where we assist with more than 350 surgical procedures monthly.
- This physician assistant Fellowship is 12 months long and will focus primarily on the intraoperative care of the patient focusing on the understanding of assisting the surgeon. Introducing the Fellow to multiple techniques in exposure, cannulation, grafting, valve intervention and tissue resection to make the Fellow well rounded in the skills to adapt in assisting most all surgeon making you versatile and adaptable creating a better outcome for

- the patients. We teach how to work efficiently independently to gain a routine and foresee many problems before they happen and then learn to quickly trouble shoot . It will all come together as you begin to pair our classroom lectures with your didactic training in PA school into a "gloves on and scrubbed" in technique driven training program.
- Clinical curriculum will include the full spectrum of patient care; however, significant focus will be placed on obtaining surgical skills and operative experience. The Fellow is expected to develop competency in endoscopic vein harvest and surgical assisting on a wide range of Cardiothoracic, Vascular, Robotic and Transplant Surgery procedures.
- For comprehensive training, you will rotate through congenital cardiac surgery, open thoracic and robotic thoracic surgery, transplants including kidney, pancreas, liver, heart, lung. There will also be time spent with the CVICU, Anesthesiologist, Perfusionist, Nursing and Surgical Scrubs along with other training classes to help with your understanding of everyone's roles and responsibilities within the surgical team.

Rotations:

- 2wks Introduction to Cardiovascular OR
 - Review Sterile Technique
 - Scrub/Gown and Gloving
 - Patient Positioning
 - Patient Prepping
 - Surgical Instruments
 - Suture Selection
 - Wound Dressing
- 1wk Anesthesiologist, Perfusion, Nursing and Scrub Personnel Shadowing: time spent in the OR with other team members to learn their role. Areas of focus will include
 - Echocardiogram
 - Arterial Line Placement
 - Central Line
 - Swan Ganz Placement
 - Anticoagulation and Reversal
 - ACT
 - Autotransfusion
 - Platelet Sequestration ? Platelet Gel Therapy
- 6wks Vascular Surgery: carotid endarterectomy (CEA), femoral femoral bypass, femoral - popliteal bypass, femoral - tibial bypass, axillary - femoral bypass, AV fistula, AAA repair, TEVAR
- 4wks Thoracic Surgery: lung biopsy, resections and pneumonectomies, decortication, chest wall resection and reconstruction, VATS procedures, lung transplant
- 4wks Robotic Surgery: thoracic procedures, kidney procedures, thymectomy
- 12wks Adult Cardiac: coronary artery bypass surgery (CABG), off pump CABG, endoscopic vein harvest (EVH), endoscopic radial artery harvest (RAH), repair of type A aortic dissection, heart transplant, aortic, mitral and tricuspid valve repair/replacement, mini AVR/MVR, right/left ventricular assist device (RVAD/LVAD), MAZE procedure

- 4wks CVICU: daily rounding, removal chest tubes, removal pacing wires
- 6wks Transplant Surgeries: heart, lung, kidney, pancreas, living kidney donors/ recipient
- 4wks Pediatric Congenital Hearts: PDA ligation, coarctation of the aorta repair, ASD repair, VSD repair, Tetralogy of Fallot repair, transposition of the great vessels repair, Truncus arteriosus repair, Norwood procedure, Glenn procedure, Fontan procedure, total anomalous pulmonary venous return (TAPVR) correction, AV canal repair

On-Call Activities:

- ❖ Due to the nature of cardiothoracic surgery, the schedule of cases can be urgent or emergent throughout the evening or weekend. Typically, these cases are more beneficial in learning due to their higher acuity of care and nature of an urgent or emergent case. To expand your experience and knowledge skillset we would like you to try to experience as many of these types of cases as your time allows to build upon your basic understanding of cardiothoracic surgery.
- ❖ You will typically have a morning case and follow the schedule of your preceptor for that day or be directed to a procedure that aligns with your current clinical rotation. Best learning opportunities occur in the after-hour times and on weekends and holidays. The goal of this program is to get the Fellow as much exposure to surgical procedures as possible. To obtain these goals, while on certain rotations after hours availability, "on call" will be every other day.
